I. The Circumstances of Paul's Contentment. (Phil. 4:10-11)

- A. Context of Contentment (10)
 - 1. Paul and the Church at Philippi.
 - A.D. 50-52; Paul plants the church at Philippi.
 - Paul completes 2nd missionary journey and begins 3rd missionary journey. Arrested.
 - Paul sent to prison.
 - A.D. 61; Paul writes thank you letter to Philippians while imprisoned.
 - 2. Philippi's ministry to Paul.
 - 3. "Revived your concern"
- B. Imprisonment and "not being in need" (11)
 - 1. House Arrest what it was like.
 - 2. Not in Need? Really?

II. Paul's Learns Contentment in Any Circumstance (Phil. 4:12)

- A. Book end #1: Bad Times.
 - 1. "to be humbled . . ." (brought low)
 - 2. "facing . . . hunger . . . "
 - 3. "facing . . . need."
- B. "Book end #2: Good Times.
 - 1. "to abound . . . "
 - 2. "Facing plenty . . . "
 - 3. "Facing . . . abundance."

III. The Secret of Paul's Contentment (Phil. 4:13)

- A. Why does Paul call this a "secret"?
- B. So, what's Paul's secret? A: Christ.
- C. Can we talk about Authorial Intent?
 - 1. Verse 13 in today's world.
 - 2. The Witch of Endor . . . no not that Endor!
 - 3. The point: Paul wants you to be content in Christ in any circumstance. Not to win the next Superbowl or bowling league championship.

IV. Renewing the Mind.

- 1. If contentment in any situation is based on Christ, what does your walk with Him look like? Take an inventory of how you relate to Christ:
 - a. How often are you in the scriptures?
 - b. How regularly do you pray?
 - c. Do you attend church regularly?
 - d. Do you serve at church regularly?

Consider all the types of situations that are in your life. Which of these are the top 3 areas you face temptation to discontentment? Consider praying about this regularly and reading scripture on these topics.
